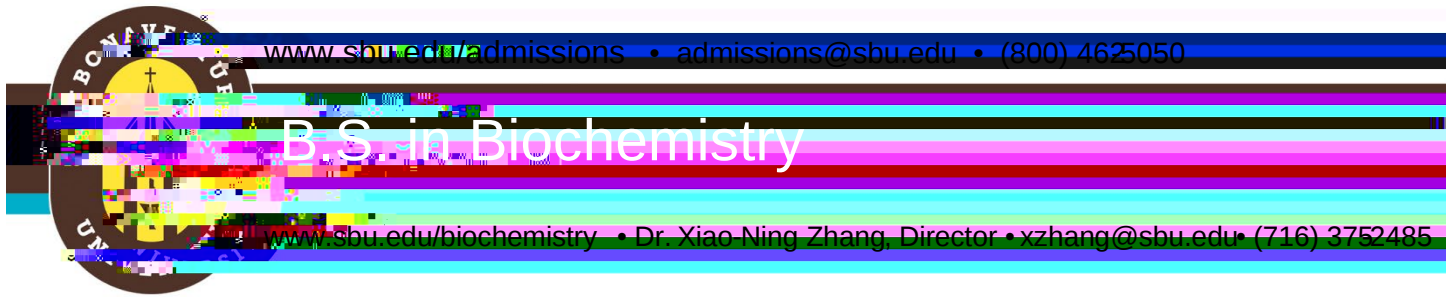


Objectives

The Department of Biology offers a program leading to the Bachelor of Science with a major in Biochemistry. The Biochemistry program provides every student with faculty-mentored, hands-on research experience with equipment suited for modern biochemistry, cell biology and molecular genetics in the William F. Walsh Science Center, a common setup found in graduate school.
