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Dual Degree Nursing Program

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Program Description

The Dual Degree Nursing program at St. Bonaventure University. Upon finishing their third year, students can take the NCLEX-RN examination to become registered nurses and begin entry level practice with an earned Associate of Applied Science in Nursing from JCC. Then in their final year, students will complete their bachelor's nursing courses with special focus on emotional intelligence, interprofessionalism, leadership, and quality care.

Since the last year of the program is presented in a hybrid format, students have the freedom to begin working as a registered nurse if he/she chooses to gain experience while finishing the bachelor's degree.

Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Dual Degree in Nursing program, graduates will be equipped to:

- Utilize the nursing process to provide quality, safe, holistic (biophysical, psychosocial, spiritual, and cultural) care to patients. Upon completion of the program, students will be able to indicate dual degree nursing as their major. This is a competitive program, with a limited number of admissions per year.
